

U-Visa and T-Visa Policy

U-Visas and T-Visas are forms of temporary immigration relief through the United States Customs and Immigration Service administers. Under these programs, Department of Homeland Security determines who is and is not eligible for relief. The “U non-immigrant status” (the “U-Visa”) is for victims of a variety of crimes, including domestic violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, involuntary servitude, and other serious offenses. The “T non-immigrant status” (the “T-Visa”) is for human trafficking victims.
